Research Objectives

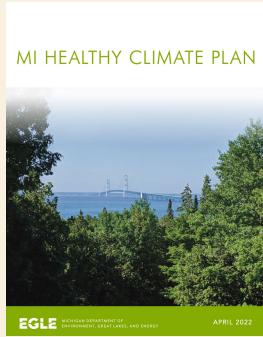
- **Analyzing Convergence:** To what extent are SDGs present in state climate plans?

Study Area

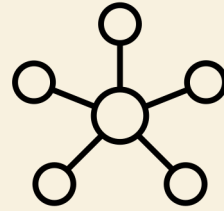

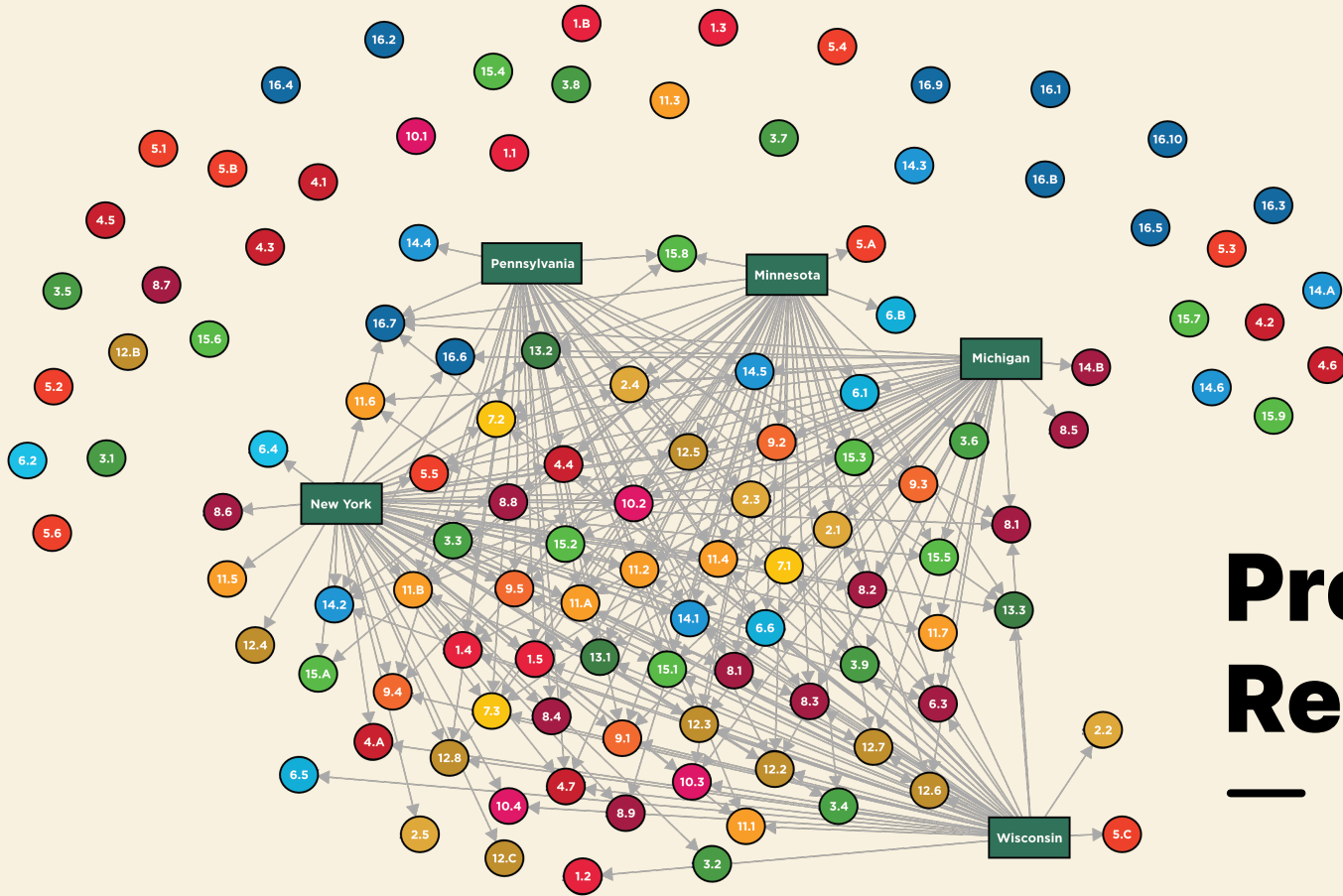

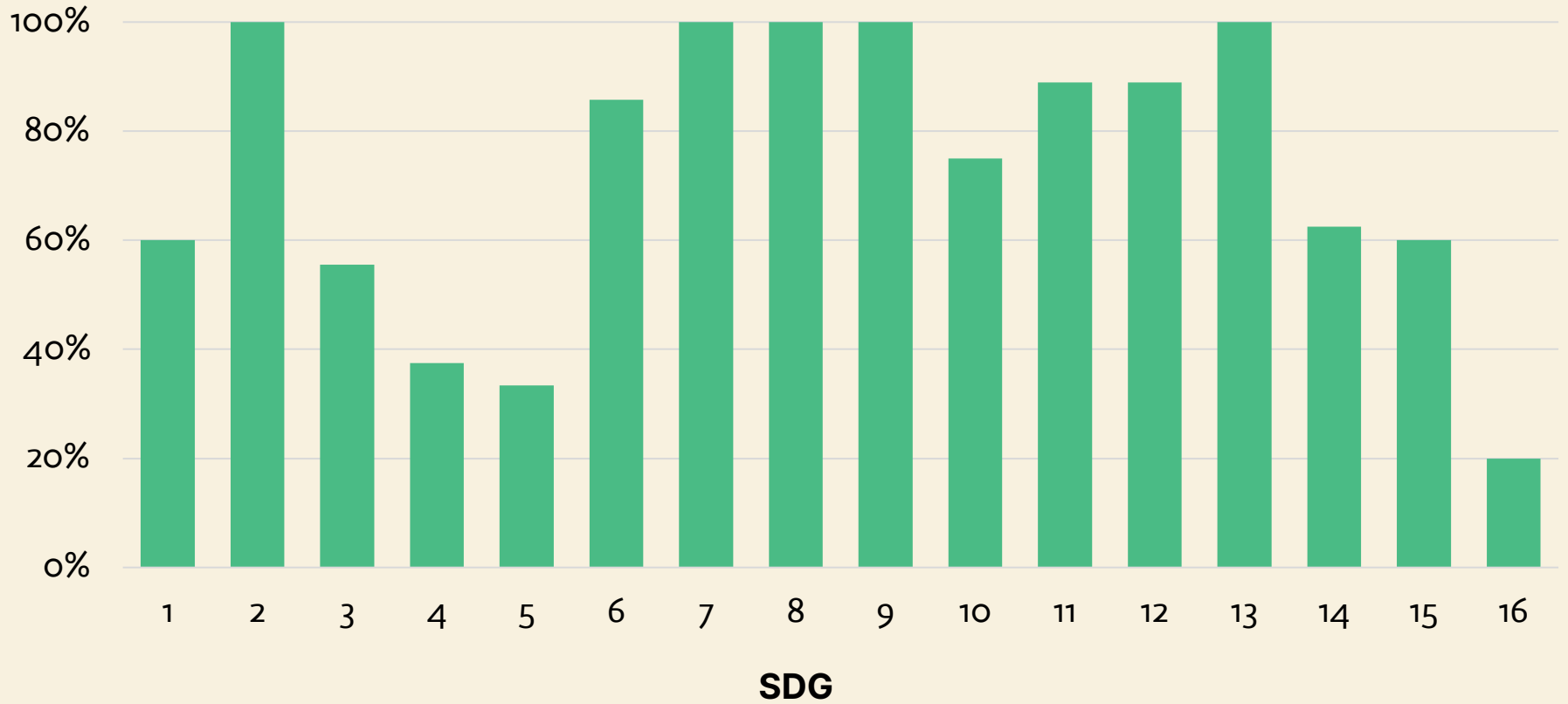
